

## FSBA BILL TRACKING LIST

(As of 1/2/11)

### **HB 11 Child-restraint Requirements by Steinberg**

Provides child-restraint requirements for certain children ages 4 through 7; provides certain exceptions; redefines term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements; provides grace period.

### **HB 19 Compensation of County Officials by Mayfield**

Authorizes each county commissioner, circuit court clerk, county comptroller, sheriff, supervisor of elections, property appraiser, and tax collector to reduce his or her salary on voluntary basis.

### **HB 27 Educational Plant Surveys by Jenne (Identical to SB 254 by Sobel)**

Authorizes extension to school district educational plant survey submission deadline; provides restrictions; provides requirements for submission of request for extension to DOE and requires department approval; provides restrictions on school district construction during extension period.

### **HB 29 Parole For Juvenile Offenders by Weinstein (Identical to SB 160 by Joyner)**

Cites this act as the "Graham Compliance Act." Provides that a juvenile offender who was less than 18 years of age at the time of commission of a nonhomicide offense and who is sentenced to life imprisonment is eligible for parole if the offender has been incarcerated for a minimum period. Requires an initial eligibility interview to determine whether the juvenile offender has demonstrated maturity and reform for parole. Provides criteria to determine maturity and reform.

### **HB 33 Allocation and Expenditure of State Lottery Revenues by Clarke-Reed**

Requires portion of Powerball net revenues to be allocated to voluntary prekindergarten education programs; provides for use of funds.

### **HB 41 Primary Sponsors of Legislation by Schwartz (Identical to SB 182 by Sobel)**

Permits naming of House and Senate primary sponsors of legislation in short title of bill and its companion when agreed to by primary sponsors of bill and companion.

### **HB 61 Code of Student Conduct by Rogers (Similar to SB 228 by Siplin)**

Requires each district school board code of student conduct to include explanation of student responsibilities with regard to appropriate student dress; requires each district school board to adopt dress code policy that prohibits student from wearing clothing that exposes underwear or body parts in specified manner; provides disciplinary actions for violation of dress code; requires adherence to code of student conduct for participation in extracurricular activities.

### **HB 67 Career and Education Planning by Bullard**

Revises general requirements for middle grades promotion to require that course in career and education planning explore National Career Clusters; deletes DOE requirement relating to course.

### **HB 69 Student Assessment in the Public Schools by Bullard (See HB 71, SB 258)**

Terminates administration of FCAT to students in grades 9 through 12; requires PSAT/NMSQT or ACT's EXPLORE and PLAN tests to replace grade 10 FCAT for purposes of measuring student's knowledge and skills; requires students to take PSAT/NMSQT in grade 10 or ACT's EXPLORE and PLAN tests in grades 9 & 10, respectively, and earn passing scores to qualify for standard high school diploma; requires State Board of Education to designate passing scores; requires use of student performance on tests for school grading purposes; provides for application beginning with students entering grade 9 in 2012-2013 school year.

**HB 71 Student Assessment in the Public Schools by Campbell** *(See HB 69, SB 258)*

Provides that FCAT shall be discontinued and shall not be administered to public school students; requires High School Competency Test (HSCT) to replace grade 10 FCAT; requires student to earn passing scores on HSTC to qualify for standard high school diploma; requires State Board of Education to designate passing scores; provides for implementation beginning with 2013-2014 school year.

**HB 75 Sexting by Abruzzo**

Provides that minor commits offense of sexting if he or she knowingly uses computer or other device to transmit or distribute photograph or video of himself or herself which depicts nudity and is harmful to minors, or knowingly possesses such photograph or video that was transmitted or distributed to minor from another minor; provides that transmission or distribution of multiple photographs or videos is single offense if such photographs and videos were transmitted or distributed in same 24-hour period; provides that possession of multiple photographs or videos that were transmitted or distributed by minor is single offense if such photographs and videos were transmitted or distributed by minor in same 24-hour period; provides that act does not prohibit prosecution of minor for conduct relating to material that includes depiction of sexual conduct or sexual excitement or for stalking.

**SB 92 Group Insurance for Public Employees by Gaetz**

Requires that school districts procure certain types of insurance through interlocal agreements. Requires that each school district in this state enter into a specified type of interlocal agreement and establish the School District Insurance Consortium. Requires the consortium to advertise for competitive bids for health, accident, or hospitalization insurance, as well as insurance plans.

**HB 93 Security Cameras by Steube** *(Identical to SB 172 by Bennett)*

Reenacts provisions relating to prohibited standards for security cameras; provides for retroactive operation of act; provides exception under specified circumstances. Effective Date: upon becoming a law, and shall operate retroactively to June 1, 2009. If such retroactive application is held by a court of last resort to be unconstitutional, this act shall apply prospectively.

**HB 107 Local Government Accountability by Smith** *(Identical to SB 224 by Dean)*

Revises provisions relating to procedures for declaring special districts inactive; specifies level of detail required for local governmental entity's proposed budget; revises provisions for local governmental entity's audit & annual financial reports; requires local governmental entity's budget to be posted online; revises budgetary guidelines for district school boards.

**SB 108 Public K-12 Health Education by Ring**

Deletes the requirement that schools teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school-age students as part of instruction in human sexuality.

**SB 154 Juvenile Justice Education Programs by Bullard**

Requires that the Department of Education submit to the Legislature an annual report that includes student learning gains and student progression in juvenile justice education programs and details the methodology that the department uses to ensure that the student performance data is complete and reliable.

**SB 174 Growth Management by Bennett**

Reenacts a specified provisions relating to the definition of "urban service area" and "dense urban land area" for purposes of the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act. Reenacts specified provisions relating to certain required and optional elements of a comprehensive plan, concurrency requirements for transportation facilities, a required notice for a new or increased impact fee, the process for adopting a comprehensive plan or plan amendment, etc.

**SB 208 Persons With Disabilities by Fasano**

Provides that persons with developmental disabilities have a right to be free from negligence. Specifies that entities as well as individuals are liable for damages. Prohibits the operator of a public lodging or food establishment from discriminating on the basis of disability. Applies administrative and civil remedies available under the Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992 to certain violations against persons with disabilities. Creates the "Floridians with Disabilities Act," etc.

**SB 230 Enforcement of Immigration Laws by Detert**

Cites this act as the "Florida Security and Immigration Compliance Act." Prohibits agencies from entering into a contract for contractual services with contractors that are not registered and participating by a specified date in a federal work-authorization program. Provides procedures with respect to verification of eligibility for benefits.

**SB 258 Student Assessment In Public Schools by Bullard (See HB 69, HB 71)**

Terminates the administration of the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) to students in grades 9 through 12. Requires that the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) replace the grade 10 FCAT for purposes of measuring a student's knowledge and skills. Requires that students earn passing scores on the PSAT/NMSQT to qualify for a standard high school diploma. . Provides for application beginning with students entering grade 9 in the 2012-2012 school year.

**SB 276 Procurement of Professional Services by Bennett**

Allows compensation to be a considering factor during the competitive selection process for architectural, engineering, and other professional services. Authorizes the governmental agency or school board to reopen negotiations with a selected firm following termination of negotiations with other firms.

**SB 288 Design Professionals by Negrón**

Provides for limited liability for engineers, surveyors and mappers, architects, interior designers, and registered landscape architects as a result of construction defects resulting from the performance of a contract. Provides that, if a contract requires professional liability insurance, the contract may not limit the liability of the design professional in a manner that is inconsistent with the insurance requirements.

**SB 290 Retirement for Elected Officials by Fasano**

Reduces the employer retirement contribution for members of the elected officers class.

**SB 300 Term Limits by Bennett**

Proposes amendments to the State Constitution to revise the term limits that apply to State Senators and State Representatives and to impose term limits on elected county and municipal officers.

**SB 310 Public Meetings by Negrón**

Provides a right for members of the public to be heard at meetings of certain governmental boards and commissions. Prescribes conditions qualifying, and exceptions to, the right. Provides for the adoption of rules governing the conduct of, and behavior at, the meetings.
