

Provide Greater Instructional Flexibility

- Provide ALL schools with the same level of flexibility as high performing districts and charter schools.
- Provide parents/guardians greater choice in retaining their child in PreK, K, 1, 2, or 3 with considerations of FAST results, portfolio, and teacher input.
- Provide flexibility in the frequency of the instructional materials schedule.
- Repeal corporal punishment giving parents/guardians ultimate authority in determining how to discipline their children at school.
- Provide greater flexibility for industry certifications under the CAPE industry certification funding list.

Reduce Administrative Processing & Reporting

- Eliminate unnecessary reports and reduce burdensome reporting such as:
 - Economic Security Report
 - Middle School Advisory Council
- Repeal the requirement for principals to collect restitution for instructional materials.
- Provide date flexibility for certifying instructional materials are aligned with state standards.
- Repeal the requirement of electronic transactions comply with requirements of DMS.

Provide Greater Capital Flexibility

- Repeal the cost per student station given the considerable cost variation between districts on the cost to build new schools.
- Provide ALL schools with the ability to sell/lease/donate buildings and materials given a
 free market with assets.

Provide Greater Compensation Flexibility

- Provide districts the ability to compensate instructional personnel for achieving advanced degrees from an accredited institution by repealing F.S.1012.22(1)(c)3.
- · Remove additional requirements for certified teachers to teach in early learning programs.
